



#### The Trade Story in Context











# Republican Policy Elites Less Sold on Trade Deals












# Passage of TPP is Expected



Regardless of how you feel about the treaty, do you expect the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) to be approved by Congress and signed into law by the President?
















# Skeptical of Benefits






#### A Win for The President?







#### Partisan Split on Trade
