

On behalf of the Boards of the Washington International Trade Association and Foundation, welcome! We are delighted you are able to join us this evening, and we are so grateful to our sponsors for their support.

SENATOR MIKE CRAPO

Senator Crapo joined the Senate Finance Committee in 2005 and became the Chairman of the Committee in January 2025, giving Idahoans a strong voice in legislation related to federal tax policy; federal social safety net and health care programs; and implementation of foreign trade agreements.

He is a current member and former Chairman of the Banking Committee; a senior member of the Budget Committee; and a member of the Joint Committee on Taxation. His sensible approach has earned him the respect of his colleagues, and he has been selected to serve in various leadership roles, and currently serves as the Chief Deputy Whip among Senate Republicans, as well as on the Committee on Committees.

Senator Crapo has been a consistent advocate for free market policies that fuel economic growth. He knows that Americans succeed when given the freedom to compete, and the entire country benefits from smart trade policies. Promoting U.S. global economic leadership through free and fair trade and competitive corporate tax policies are among his top priorities.


He received his law degree from Harvard Law School and undergraduate degree from Brigham Young University. He served six years in the House of Representatives and eight years in the Idaho State Senate, where he served as Senate President Pro Tem, before being elected to the U.S. Senate in 1998.





SENATOR MICHAEL BENNET

Michael Bennet has represented Colorado in the United States Senate since 2009. Widely recognized as a pragmatic and independent thinker, he is driven by a deep-seated obligation to create more opportunity for the next generation. Michael has built a reputation of taking on Washington dysfunction and working with Republicans and Democrats to address our nation's greatest challenges – including education, climate change



challenges – including education, climate change, immigration, health care, and national security.

He was a member of the bipartisan "Gang of 8"— four Democrats and four-Republicans — that introduced and passed a bill through the Senate to fix our broken immigration system. He continues to work with bipartisan colleagues to secure common sense immigration reforms to boost the economy, strengthen our national security, and provide a fair path to citizenship for millions undocumented immigrants.

As a member of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence and Senate Committee on Finance, Michael believes the U.S. must play a leading diplomatic, economic, and military role in the world to secure our interests, protect our homeland, and advance our values. He believes the United States should not only maintain but strengthen the international order crafted by visionary American public servants after World War II to peacefully resolve conflicts and ensure rules-based international exchange. In the 21st century, this means standing up against aggression by autocrats, like Russia's Vladimir Putin, by supporting democracies like Ukraine; deepening alliances and partnerships in Latin America and the Caribbean, the Indo-Pacific, Europe, and beyond; working with allies and partners and investing in our military to deter autocratic aggression; and embarking on mutually-beneficial trade to open international markets to American companies and advance U.S. interests.

As Colorado's U.S. Senator, Michael has fought to invest in clean energy to create jobs and help break our reliance on overseas oil, to uphold our commitment to Colorado's veterans and military families, and to preserve Colorado's rich agricultural tradition underpinned by our family farmers and ranchers. Michael and his wife Susan Daggett, a natural resources lawyer, are the parents of three daughters: Caroline, Halina, and Anne.
