

Ambassador Rick Switzer is the Deputy United States Trade Representative. Prior to his appointment as Deputy USTR, he was the founder and principal of ProjX Technology Consulting. During Rick's 20 year career as a member of the Foreign Service he served as the State Department visiting professor at the National Intelligence University teaching graduate courses on China's economy and innovation system, as a member of the Secretary of State's Policy Planning Council, and a Senior State Department Advisor to the Department of Defense working with the Air Force and the Army.

Other highlights include serving as the Environment, Science, Technology and Health Counselor at Embassy Beijing, the largest science section in the world. While on sabbatical from State, he also spent a year as a Senior Fellow at the Special Competitive Studies Project (SCSP), a non-profit founded by former Google CEO Eric Schmidt. Before his government service, Rick cofounded a wireless technology start-up and also conducted innovation policy research at the University of California.

Gary Shapiro is Vice Chair and CEO of the Consumer Technology Association (CTA) which represents over 1200 consumer technology companies and owns and produces CES.

Over a more than 30-year tenure as head of CTA, Shapiro expanded the association's influence and impact alongside the growth of the technology industry. He has also transformed CES, expanding its reach globally.

A Georgetown Law graduate, Shapiro worked on Capitol Hill and served as an associate at the Squire Sanders law firm before joining CTA in 1982. This legal experience and a passion for policies that empower entrepreneurs and unlock technology innovation earn him regular recognition as a Washingtonian Tech Titan and Washington Life magazine's most influential people in Washington. In 2021, Shapiro was recognized by French President Emmanuel Macron with the prestigious Legion of Honor Award.

Shapiro is the New York Times bestselling author of "Pivot or Die: How Leaders Thrive when Everything Changes" (HarperCollins, 2025), "Ninja Future: Secrets to Success in the New World of Innovation" (HarperCollins, 2019), "Ninja Innovation: The Ten Killer Strategies of the World's Most Successful Businesses" (HarperCollins, 2013) and "The Comeback: How Innovation will Restore the American Dream" (Beaufort, 2011).

Shapiro is active in policy, thought leadership, government, and community development alongside his position at CTA. In October 2025, he received The Media Institute's Freedom of Speech Award, honoring leadership in technology and advocacy for free expression. He sits on boards and advisory councils including the Northern Virginia Technology Council, CEO Update Roundtable, Council of Manufacturing Associations board, and Focused Ultrasound Foundation board.

Shapiro holds a JD from the Georgetown University Law Center and a BA in economics and psychology from Binghamton University.

Brandon Remington serves as the Deputy Under Secretary for Policy at the International Trade Administration. In this role, he advises Under Secretary Kimmitt on matters of investment, commercial diplomacy, trade, global competitiveness, and technology priorities, including supply chains, investment, and Al.

Brandon was the Chief Strategy Officer at the Office of Strategic Capital where he helped create the first federal credit program in the Department of Defense. Brandon held several roles developing AI capabilities in the Pentagon, including as the Chief Innovation Officer at the Chief Digital and AI Office (CDAO) for the Secretary of Defense, and as an AI integration officer at Project Maven, the inaugural AI program in the U.S. military. President and CEO, United States Council for International Business



An accomplished diplomat with a distinguished career in international affairs, Baird is a passionate advocate for open markets, trade, and the role of business in promoting economic prosperity and social progress.

Baird's extensive experience in government and business has fostered a deep understanding of the challenges and opportunities facing the global economy. Prior to joining USCIB, Baird served as the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for the Bureau of Economic and Business Affairs at the U.S. Department of State, leading efforts to promote American economic interests abroad in close collaboration with U.S. businesses, foreign governments, and international organizations. Baird also led the U.S. Mission to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) as Chargé d'Affaires from 2020-2022, representing American interests in this key forum on economic policy, trade, and development.

Robert D. Atkinson is founder and president of the Information Technology and Innovation Foundation (ITIF), the world's leading think tank for science and technology policy. He is an internationally recognized scholar, a widely published author, and a trusted adviser to policymakers around the world, with expertise in the broad economics of innovation and specific policy and regulatory questions around new and emerging technologies. Rob's most recent book, co-authored with Michael Lind, is Big Is Beautiful: Debunking the Myth of Small Business.

Before founding ITIF, Rob's was Vice President of the Progressive Policy Institute and Director of PPI's Technology & New Economy Project. He received his Masters in Urban and Regional Planning from the University of Oregon and was named a distinguished alumnus in 2014. He received his Ph.D. in City and Regional Planning from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1989.

Geoffrey Gertz is a senior fellow with the Energy, Economics, and Security Program at the Center for a New American Security (CNAS) and co-host of the Derisky Business podcast. His research focuses on economic tools for protecting and promoting critical technologies; digital policy and data governance; and geoeconomic competition.

Prior to joining CNAS, Gertz served as director for international economics at the White House, jointly appointed to the National Security Council and the National Economic Council, where his portfolio covered emerging technology and digital policy. He also served as senior advisor at the State Department's Bureau of Cyberspace and Digital Policy, where he covered U.S. diplomatic engagement on digital economy regulations and cross-border data flows.

Before entering government, Gertz was a fellow in the Global Economy and Development program at the Brookings Institution, a non-resident research associate at the University of Oxford's Global Economic Governance Programme, and an adjunct professor at George Washington University. He has published widely in both policy and academic publications, including The New York Times, Foreign Affairs, The Washington Quarterly, Foreign Policy, The Washington Post, the Review of International Political Economy, International Studies Quarterly, and World Development, and is frequently cited by major media outlets including, The Wall Street Journal, Financial Times, Reuters, PBS, and The Guardian.

He received a DPhil (PhD) and MPhil in international relations from the University of Oxford, and a BA in economics from DePauw University.

DR. ALINA POLYAKOVA





Dr. Alina Polyakova is President and CEO of the Center for European Policy Analysis (CEPA) as well as the Donald Marron Senior Fellow at the Henry A. Kissinger Center for Global Affairs at the Johns Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS).

Dr. Polyakova is a recognized expert on transatlantic relations, European security including Russia and Ukraine, tech policy, and populism. She is the author of the book, The Dark Side of European Integration, which examines the rise of far-right political movements in Europe, as well as dozens of major policy reports and articles in outlets such as The Washington Post, The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, Foreign Affairs, and The Atlantic, and others. She is a frequent commentator in major media outlets, such as Fox News, CNN, and BBC.

Dr. Polyakova is an experienced leader with previous roles as the Founding Director for Global Democracy and Emerging Technology at the Brookings Institution, Director of Research for Europe and Eurasia at the Atlantic Council, among others. She has also held numerous prestigious fellowships, including at the National Science Foundation, the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars, and the Fulbright Foundation, among others. She serves on the board of the Free Russia Foundation and is a member of the Leadership Council for Women in National Security (LCWINS) and the Scientific Council of the Elcano Royal Institute. Dr. Polyakova holds a Ph.D. and MA in Sociology from the University of California, Berkeley, and a BA in Economics and Sociology from Emory University.

The Honorable Nazak Nikakhtar brings over two decades of experience in international trade and national security to help clients succeed in the domestic and global marketplace. In these roles, Nazak was the agency's primary liaison with U.S. industry and trade associations, and she shaped major initiatives to strengthen U.S. industry competitiveness, promote innovation, and accelerate economic and job growth. As one of the key national security experts in the U.S. government, she developed and implemented innovative laws, regulations, and policies to safeguard strategically important technologies, strengthen the U.S. industrial base, and protect the national security and foreign policy interests of the United States. As the Department's lead on the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS), she played a key role in shaping U.S. investment policy. As the head of the agency's trade policy office, she advised the U.S. government on legal and economic issues impacting critical technologies, advanced manufacturing, financial services, ecommerce, data privacy, cybersecurity, critical minerals/rare earths, and energy competition. Finally, as the federal agency's lead on supply chain assessments, Nazak spearheaded the United States' first-ever whole-of-government initiative to evaluate and strengthen supply chains across all strategic sectors of the economy.

REP. SUZAN DELBENE (D-WA-1)

Congresswoman Suzan DelBene represents Washington's 1st Congressional District, which includes parts of King and Snohomish Counties.

First sworn into the House of Representatives in November 2012, Suzan brings a unique voice to the nation's capital with more than two decades of experience as a successful technology entrepreneur and business leader.

Suzan takes on a wide range of challenges both in Congress and in the 1st District. She is a leader on issues of technology, health care, trade, taxes, and environmental conservation, and is a champion for working families.

She serves on the House Ways and Means Committee, which is at the forefront of creating a more equitable tax code, health care reform, trade deals, and lasting retirement security. She serves on the Select Revenue Measures and Trade Subcommittees.

Suzan also serves as Co-chair of the Women's High-Tech Coalition, Kidney Caucus, and MedTech Caucus. She is also a member of the Pro-Choice Caucus. Suzan is Chair-emeritus of the forward-thinking New Democrat Coalition after chairing the coalition in the 117th Congress.

Suzan spent part of her early childhood in Newport Hills and Mercer Island before her father lost his job. After fourth grade, her family moved all over the country in search of work. Through hard work and financial aid, she earned her BA in biology from Reed College.

She started her career in immunology research before earning an MBA from the University of Washington and embarking on a successful career as a technology leader and innovator. Over more than two decades as an executive and entrepreneur, she helped start drugstore.com and served as CEO and President of Nimble Technology, a business software company based on technology developed at the University of Washington. Suzan also spent 12 years at Microsoft, most recently as corporate vice president of the company's mobile communications business.

Before being elected to Congress, Suzan served as Director of the Washington State Department of Revenue. During her tenure, she proposed reforms to cut red tape for small businesses. She also enacted an innovative tax amnesty program that generated \$345 million to help close the state's budget gap while easing financial burdens on small businesses.

Suzan's real-world experience in both the private and public sectors gives her a deep understanding of how to build successful businesses, create jobs, implement real fiscal accountability, and adopt policies that provide individuals with access to opportunity.

Suzan and her husband, Kurt DelBene, have two children, two grandchildren, and a dog named Reily.

REP. DARIN LAHOOD (R-IL-18)



U.S. House of Representatives

Congressman Darin LaHood, born and raised in Peoria, serves the constituents of the 16th District of Illinois. Originally sworn into the US House of Representatives on September 17, 2015, after winning a special election, he won re-election to serve his fourth full term in Congress on November 8, 2022. From 2015 to 2023, LaHood represented the 18th Congressional District, serving much of central and west-central Illinois. Following a redistricting process, LaHood was drawn into the new 16th Congressional District.

The 16th District spans 21 counties across central and northwestern Illinois, ranging from McLean County (Bloomington-Normal) and Peoria County (Peoria) to Winnebago (Rockford) and Jo Daviess (Galena). LaHood serves over 725,000 constituents.

Prior to his election to Congress, LaHood served four years in the Illinois State Senate, beginning in 2011. LaHood spent more than nine years as a State and Federal Prosecutor. From 2001-2006, he worked for the U.S. Department of Justice as an Assistant United States Attorney in Las Vegas, Nevada and was selected as the Chief Terrorism Prosecutor. LaHood has also served as an Assistant State's Attorney in Cook County and Tazewell County. From 2006 up until his election to the House of Representatives, he practiced with the Peoria law firm of Miller, Hall & Triggs.

LaHood currently serves on the powerful House Ways and Means Committee after being selected by his colleagues in January of 2018. The Ways and Means Committee is the House's oldest committee and has jurisdiction over all taxation and other revenue-raising measures, trade and tariffs, healthcare, and Social Security. LaHood serves as the Chairman of the Ways and Means Subcommittee on Work and Welfare and is a member of the Subcommittee on Trade.

In March of 2021, LaHood was appointed to serve on the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence. The committee oversees the nation's intelligence agencies including components of the Departments of Defense, Homeland Security, Justice, State, Treasury and Energy.

In January of 2022, LaHood was appointed to serve on the House Select Committee on the Chinese Communist Party. The Committee will examine the threats posed by the Chinese Communist Party, including economically and militarily, and work to strengthen American competitiveness.


During his time in Congress, LaHood has a strong conservative record of leadership for his constituents in Illinois, promoting economic development, fiscal responsibility, protecting American jobs, and support for our nation's law enforcement community and America's national security interests. LaHood has been an outspoken advocate for creating a better business climate, reducing our federal deficit, advocating for better international market access for Illinois farmers, lowering taxes for working families, and supporting the needs of rural healthcare providers and patient access. He believes strengthening America's national security is essential to combat foreign threats from China, Russia, and Iran and making America more competitive globally.

LaHood also serves on the House Democracy Partnership and currently co-chairs the bipartisan US-China Working Group, Digital Trade Caucus, U.S.-Lebanon Friendship Caucus, and Congressional Soccer Caucus.

LaHood, a third-generation Peorian, graduated from Spalding High School. He earned a B.A. from Loras College and holds a J.D. from the University of Illinois-Chicago John Marshall Law School. An enthusiastic athlete, he has completed five marathons and enjoys hiking, biking, and backpacking. Congressman LaHood and his wife Kristen currently reside in Peoria and are the proud parents of three sons, McKay, Lucas, and Teddy.
